Identification of Measurable Goals

1. Public Education and Outreach on Storm Water Impacts

Goal

Public education and outreach.

- Develop Town website with links to Soil & Water Conservation Office
- Provide printed material from Soil and Water Conservation Office in Town Hall
- Store educational reference materials in new town library
- Invite representatives of Soil and Water Conservation to the annual Community Day celebration
- Low impact development: encourage cul-de-sacs with landscaped centers
- In Class A soils discourage curbs and encourage evenly sloped sides for natural drainage
- Water conservation: Encourage sunken islands in parking lots for aquifer recharge

2. Public Involvement/Participation

Goal

- Provide printed material from Soil and Water Conservation Office in Town Hall
- Store educational reference materials in the town library
- Identify contact person
- Public Hearing on SWMP and annual reports, if warranted
- Advisory Partner w/ Soil & Water Conservation Office
- Become active in the Fishkill Creek Watershed Planning Committee
- Establish adopt a stream program
- Sweep all Town roads once annually

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3. Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination

Goal

- Outfall mapping
- Illicit discharges prohibited
- Develop public notification of hazards from illicit discharges
- Identify illicit discharges
- Perform annual system inspections
- Identify failing septic systems
- Identify illegal dumping

4. Construction Site Storm Water Runoff Control

Goal

- Provide public comment on construction plans
- Require construction site plan review
- Require overall construction site waste management
- Site inspections and enforcement
- Education and training of construction site operators with assistance from Soil & Water Conservation Office

5. Post-Construction Storm Water Management

Goal

- Identify MS4 discharges contributing to water quality problems
- Develop and implement management practice inspection and maintenance program. Provide training from DCS&WCD for Code Enforcement Office, Planning Board members and Highway Superintendent

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6. Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations

Goal

- Prevent discharge of pollutants by municipal operations
- Obtain DEC NPS Management Practices Catalog, or equivalent
- Implement required management practices
- Conduct employee pollution training in conjunction with DCS&WCD annually
- Recycle all used oil and anti-freeze
- Sweep all town roads annually
- Seed disturbed road side ditches immediately after disturbance
- Take soil samples of recreation fields for proper nutrient management every three years
- Wash town owned vehicles on pervious surfaces
- Pump out municipal owned septic systems every three years
- Clean 1/3 of all catchbasins in town each year
- Inspect 20% of all outfalls each year
- Inspect 100% of all outfalls in the East of Hudson watershed each year
