

**BEEKMAN TOWN BOARD – PUBLIC HEARING & REGULAR MEETING – November 8, 2012**

The Regular Meeting of the Beekman Town Board was called to order at 5:13PM with Supervisor Matthew D. Kennedy presiding. The Meeting was held in the meeting room at Town Hall.

Supervisor Matthew D. Kennedy began the Meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence in Honor of our Troops who have served and those currently serving. He made one administrative announcement regarding the location of the fire exits.

Supervisor Kennedy advised the public that this meeting was postponed from last night due to the inclement weather.

**PUBLIC HEARING – 2013 PRELIMINARY BUDGET**

At 5:14pm Supervisor Kennedy moved to open the Public Hearing on the Preliminary Budget seconded by Councilwoman Zulauf, all in favor. Supervisor Kennedy asked for public comment. There was no public comment on the Preliminary Budget Public Hearing. At 5:14pm Supervisor Kennedy moved to close this Public Hearing seconded by Councilman Mangeri, all in favor.

**PUBLIC HEARING – AMENDING LOCAL LAW FOR DOGS & OTHER ANIMALS**

At 5:15pm Supervisor Kennedy moved to open the Public Hearing on Amending Local Law for Dogs & Other Animals seconded by Councilman Mangeri, all in favor. Supervisor Kennedy briefly explained that we have a leash law in the Town of Beekman and due to the newly created Dog Park we need to amend that leash law to state that within the confines of the Dog Park no leash is necessary. Supervisor Kennedy asked for public comment. There was no public comment on the Public Hearing Amending Local Law for Dogs & Other Animals. At 5:16pm Supervisor Kennedy moved to close Public Hearing seconded by Councilman Mangeri, all in favor.

The Regular Portion of the Beekman Town Board Meeting began at 5:17pm.

**REPORTS:**

**SUPERVISOR:**

Supervisor Kennedy reported on the effects Hurricane Sandy had on the Town of Beekman. The Town of Beekman experienced significant power outages; however, he was happy to report as of this morning every Beekman resident had been restored. He worked very hard to get power restored to the resident on Beekman Road who was without power for 11 days. The Supervisor thanked Tony Coviello and the Highway Department for all their hard work throughout the storm. Everyone worked together to distribute dry ice and water to those residents in need. Our community came together in a commendable way, people were eager to help in any way they could.

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The Veterans Day Ceremony that was scheduled for this Sunday the 11<sup>th</sup> of November 2012 has been cancelled. The Hurricane caused water damage to the Colorguard uniforms and some equipment so they are unable to perform. Senator Greg Ball also cancelled his Veterans Hall of Fame Event due to damage done by Hurricane Sandy.

Supervisor Kennedy made mention that our Highway Superintendent, Tony Coviello is here and will give his report this evening. He congratulated Tony on his win in Tuesday's Election. He also congratulated all the other candidates who won on Election Day.

**TOWN BOARD:**

Councilwoman Zulauf reported the Town Board road cleanup was very successful. She made a special acknowledgement to Peter Rancourt Jr. for his participation in assisting clean up on Main Street. She reported that she attended the Dutchess County's assessment of Beekman Road. She thanked Tony Coviello, the Highway Department and the Beekman Fire Department for all their efforts during the Hurricane. She made mention that the whole Town Board came together to distribute ice and water. Her son and her husband helped as well. When the Town ran short of dry ice she was able to obtain block ice from across the river which was also distributed to the residents without power. Lastly, Councilwoman Zulauf reported that she attended the Fire Commissioner's meeting where they discussed routine business.

Councilman Mangeri reported that he participated in the Town Board road cleanup. He thanked the Highway Department for their efforts during Hurricane Sandy and recognized all the residents of the Town stating everyone handled themselves well during this trying time.

**HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT REPORT:**

Highway Superintendent, Tony Coviello started his report by thanking the Town Board and expressed his gratitude for winning the election. The Highway Department resurfaced 1/3 of Clap Hill Road and paved the aprons. They filled over 500 sand bags and placed them throughout various flood areas in Town in preparation of Hurricane Sandy. After the storm the men cut and chipped fallen limbs and trees. Tony thanked all the Town Board members for their assistance with the ice and water distribution. Due to the first snowfall of this season, the men worked until approximately 11pm last night.

Lastly, Tony distributed literature to the Town Board regarding an Information Station. This unit would allow the Town to broadcast important news and updates via an AM radio station. The approximate cost would be \$10,000; however, there are grants available.

OTHER BUSINESS:

SALES TAX RESOLUTION

COUNCILMAN MANGERI offers the following and moves for its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Town of Beekman has received correspondence from Dutchess County Executive Marcus J. Molinaro stating that the County will be reducing the Town of Beekman’s portion of county sales tax revenue by at least 15% for fiscal year 2013; and WHEREAS, under the County Executive’s proposed plan the Town of Beekman stands to lose approximately \$120,000 in sales tax revenue.

WHEREAS, the County Executive has announced, as part of a plan to close the County’s deficit, the County will keep a larger share of the county sales tax revenue and impose a cap on the aggregate share of the county sales tax revenue for all cities, towns and villages to \$25 million dollars starting in 2013; and

WHEREAS, since 1989, all Dutchess County cities, towns and villages have depended on this vital revenue source as a significant component of their local budgets helping stabilize the real property tax levy; and

WHEREAS, all municipalities have fairly shared from the benefit from the growth in sales tax revenue in good economic times, and have fairly shared the burden from a decline in the county sales tax revenue during difficult economic times; and

WHEREAS, the Governor and the New York State Legislature enacted a property tax cap of two percent (2%) in 2011 for all local governments without any mandate relief, adding to the difficulty for local governments to meet its fiduciary obligations; and

WHEREAS, the changes in sales tax revenue distribution formula proposed by County Executive Molinaro disproportionately and adversely impacts all cities, towns, and villages which will result in many municipalities having to cut services and increase its property tax levy to offset the loss of the county sales tax revenue, and in many cases, will require municipalities to override their mandatory two percent property tax cap; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, The recitations above set forth are incorporated in this Resolution as if fully set forth and adopted herein; and

BE IT FURTHER; RESOLVED, the Town Board of Beekman hereby declares its opposition to any changes to the county sales tax revenue distribution formula as proposed by the County Executive which creates undue hardship on the local governments of the Dutchess County, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board of Beekman calls upon Dutchess County Legislator Chairman Rob Rolison, Dutchess County Legislator Minority Leader Barbara Jeter-Jackson, and Dutchess County Legislator Gerald Hutchings on behalf of the people of the Town of Beekman oppose the changes in the county sales tax distribution formula; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board of Beekman calls upon the entire Dutchess County Legislature to oppose and reject any proposed changes to county sales tax distribution and revenue sharing with all the cities, towns, and villages of Dutchess County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board of Beekman directs our Town Clerk Rachael Rancourt to memorialize a copy of this resolution to the Clerk of the Dutchess County Legislature, the entire Dutchess County Legislature, and the County Executive, hereby expressing the Town of Beekman’s formal opposition to the proposed change in the distribution of the county sales tax to

the cities, towns, and villages of Dutchess County.

Councilwoman Zulauf questions Supervisor Kennedy about a conversation he had with John Adams regarding the weather vane on top of Town Hall. Originally the Town Hall was constructed to be the Fire House so the weather vane is of a Fireman holding a hose. John Adams is asking to have the weather vane donated to the Fire Department. Attorney David Sears stated it would have to be done by a resolution.

Councilwoman Zulauf moves to donate the fireman weather vane on top of Town Hall to the Fire Department in exchange for the Fire Department to replace it with another weather vane. There was no second to this motion, Supervisor Kennedy would like to discuss further at the next Town Board Meeting.

Councilwoman Zulauf questions Comptroller Fred Knapp if the outside audit has been performed? He stated that it had been postponed and will take place in the beginning of December. The audit will take approximately 4 days and the report will be available a week to 10 days after the audit is complete.

Comptroller Fred Knapp stated the health insurance issue has been resolved and the Town received a letter from the health insurance company apologizing for their error.

Supervisor Kennedy stated that the Highway Department will conduct brush clean up from storm debris. Residents should drag said brush to the edge of the road. Councilman Mangeri questioned if FEMA would reimburse us for brush clean up. Comptroller Fred Knapp stated that we can apply for it and see if they approve it.

Supervisor Kennedy made a motion for brush clean-up to commence on Tuesday, November 13, 2012 to be completed on Tuesday, November 20, 2012. He authorized the Highway Superintendent to retain not more than two temporary employees to assist in this process. Councilman Mangeri seconded the motion.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT:

Len Jerrum – Beyer Drive, Thanked Supervisor Kennedy for all his phone calls and updates throughout the storm keeping the public aware. He stated that Beekman has a contract with Comcast and he advised the Town to look into having them broadcast information pertaining to inclement weather to notify the public. Questioned what happened to the Emergency Preparedness Committee? Stated that the Town should have the Historian give a presentation on the history of the weather vane that was mentioned above. Regarding the pile of debris where the Town Transfer Station operates he stated we should look into possibly selling the scrap metal. Advised the public to keep their eyes open for deer at night and to turn off your bright lights when passing oncoming traffic.
